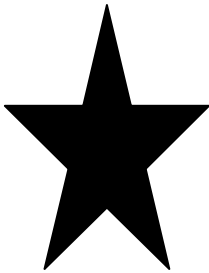
Haitian Relief Local activity:

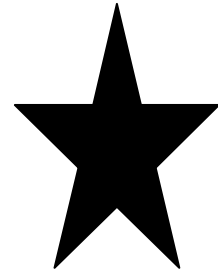
