**RCIA or the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**

**The Scrutinies:** During the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent, we the Church pray for the Elect during ceremonies called the Scrutinies. The word scrutinize means to "examine closely" The elect have been examining and reflecting on their lives during their final period of preparation for receipt of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, They have been praying for God's help and grace to heal what is broken and build up all that is strong and good. We join them in that prayer for God's strength and guidance.

The elect are also presented with the Creed and the Our Father during this time. The parish community entrusts these prayers to them as a sign of faith and enlightenment—these prayers express the heart of our community's faith life and prayer. The Elect and the candidates will participate fully in Holy Week services with the parish family. They will become fully-initiated members of our community at the Easter Vigil Mass on April 3rd.

### Haitian Relief Local activity:

St Peter Church, in conjunction with the other Keys parishes (St Mary's, San Pablo, San Pedro and St Justin) will be sending humanitarian aid to Haiti. This will be a concerted effort by the people of Monroe County to collect materials and money. The materials will be transported directly to Petit Goave in Haiti from Key West. The reason Petit Goave was selected is that it was heavily impacted by the earthquake, is a waterfront community and Fr. Lesley Jean (from St. Mary's) is originally from that city and has connections with the Sisters of Wisdom who have the ability to arrange secure delivery to those in need.

The materials are being collected at a location (5180 Overseas Hwy) on Stock Island (formerly the Dollar Store) generously donated by Mr. & Mrs. Bill Murray.

**Donations of material are being accepted now through Saturday, March 20th. The collection site is open Monday through Friday from 3-6pm and from 9-5 on Saturdays. If you would rather bring your donations to St. Peter's, we are storing collected items under the Ministry Center.

Money—it will be used to pay expenses of transport and any left over will purchase plywood, rice, etc. **Fr. Lesley Jean has requested solar showers. These portable, plastic containers hold up to 10 gallons of water and can be hung in the sun to warm the water. He said that the people have water, but lack the ability to heat the water. We will designate a portion of donations to buying approximately 100 of these.** Make checks payable to St. Mary Star of the Sea Haiti Fund or to St. Peter's Catholic Church Haiti Fund.

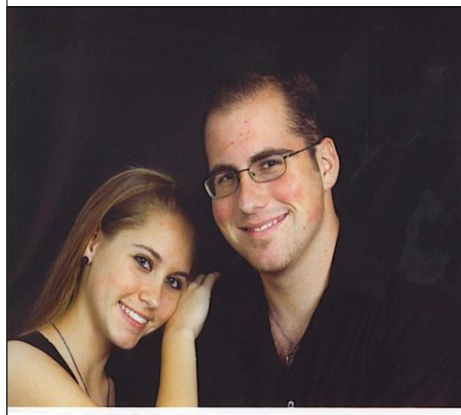


**Meet Derrick and DeAnna Conover**

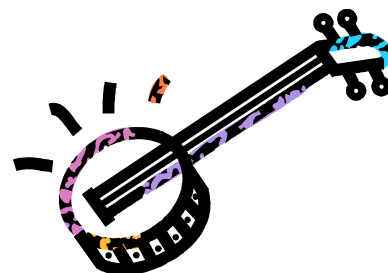
